

7 New Graduates Eager and Ready to Work in the Tourism Industry

Fredericton, June 19th, 2009 – The Tourism Industry Association of New Brunswick (TIANB) is pleased to announce the graduation of its most recent participants from the *Ready-to-Work* Tourism Career Program. June 19 marks the completion date of a very successful program in Fredericton with 7 newly trained and eager potential employees.

Tourism is the fastest growing, most sustainable industry in the province, yet still a shortage of skilled labour is an ongoing challenge. So far in 2009, three very positive programs have been completed in Fredericton, Moncton, and St-Isidore allowing 29 trained potential employees to enhance their skills before entering the workforce. Since January, 80% have begun work in exciting careers in the tourism industry.

The *Ready-to-Work* program, delivered free to participants by TIANB, is a three-week Nationally recognized skills development program that is designed to assist the unemployed with their transition into the work force and to help individuals interested in a career change. Participants graduate from the *Ready-to-Work* Program armed with six certifications, including well-known **international customer service** training programs *SuperHost*, *Foodsafe*, *Responsible Beverage*, *Organizational Practices*, *emerit* tourism essentials, as well as **First Aid** and **CPR**. They have also successfully completed a nationally recognized tourism skills assessment exam.

TIANB is grateful to have the support of partners such as CTHRC (Canadian Tourism Human Resource Council) and the Department of Post-Secondary Education, Training and Labour for the delivery of this dynamic and vital program. As well, we wish to recognize the local partners who provided their time and support through site visits and in-class presentations: the Beaverbrook Art Gallery, Crowne Plaza Lord Beaverbrook Hotel, Fredericton Tourism, Harvest Jazz and Blues Festival and Kingswood Golf.
